2007 - 2008 DRESS CODE

**FOOD SERVICE MANAGERS
And FOOD SERVICE WORKERS**

REQUIRED:

Tops: Uniform or scrub tops that are pullover, snap or button front, in print or solid colors shall be worn. Clean aprons are required over uniform or scrub tops.

RECOMMENDED:

Pants: Professional-looking pants should not be so tightly fitting that they restrict movement. (i.e. uniform looking cotton pants in blue, black, white or tan).

Shoes: Polished, low-heeled shoes with clean shoelaces and non-skid soles, preferably to match pants, shall be worn with hose or socks. Solid color, athletic shoes (no canvas type) or closed-toe, leather walking shoes are acceptable.

ACCEPTABLE JEWELRY:

Rings: Wedding bands only. No other jewelry is acceptable (e.g., earrings, bracelets and necklaces).

FINGERNAILS will be clean. Natural nails only. No polish or any type of gel, acrylic or silk wrap can be worn. Gloves must be worn at all times when handling food.

HAIRNETS will be worn to completely cover hair. Professional-looking, decorative hairnets and hair accessories are permitted with approval of manager. Student workers must wear hairnets or paper hats when working in the dish room, on the serving line or in the kitchen area. Hairnets and hats are not required in the dining room.

It is the responsibility of the Food Service Manager to set a good example, to enforce this dress code, and to make sure that all food service staff maintains a professional appearance.
